Chair Joseph welcomed Trustee Jerome Revish to the Columbus State Board of Trustees.

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Chair Joseph shared that 2020 has brought many challenges, as well as numerous opportunities for innovation. He encouraged Columbus State administrators and Trustees to spend time reflecting on the significant accomplishments the College has made in the midst of a worldwide crisis.

He commented the College has pushed through with its mission, strategy, and focus on student success, both of which are to be commended. Specific congratulations were given to President Harrison and Cabinet for their accomplishments on the early decision to move to all-virtual instruction methods, the development of work-from-home protocols, and for the deliberative process of building a diversity, equity, and inclusion strategy.

President Harrison thanked Chair Joseph for his comments on the College's perseverance and innovation in 2020. He mirrored Chair Joseph's sentiments and provided sincere thanks to the Trustees, Cabinet, and the collective employee base.

Dr. Desiree Polk-Bland was named Vice President of Student Affairs. She has over 23 years' experience in higher education and community college leadership, specializing in student development and holistic student support.

Before Columbus State, she held roles at Tidewater Community College, Ivy Tech Community College, and Indiana University East. She earned her Ph.D. in Leadership for Higher Education from Capella University, two Master's degrees from Indiana University, and a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Cincinnati.

Dr. Polk-Bland has served for over ten-years at Columbus State Community College in various leadership roles.

• Charles W. Noble III, Esq. Named Chief of Staff

Charles W. Noble III, Esq. has been named Chief of Staff. He joined the College in March 2020.

Prior to Columbus State he was the Chief Strategy Officer and Chief Legal Counsel at Franklin County Department of Job & Family Services; Director of African American Male Initiatives at the Columbus Urban League; and Program Manager for Boys and Men of Color Initiatives at the Kirwan Institute for the Study of Race and Ethnicity.

Mr. Noble earned his Juris Doctor (J.D.) from The Ohio State University Moritz College of Law and his Master's Degree in Urban Planning from the University of Maryland College Park.
