# HOW STRESSORS AFFECT CHILDREN

**High School students of low-income families drop out at 6X the rate of students from high-income families.**

**By Kindergarten over 48% of low-income children have lived in at least 3 different homes.**

# Data link poverty, performance

No school district with more than 50 percent poverty scored an A on the performance index.

- Poverty rates continue to have a direct, negative link to Ohio student achievement.
- Districts scoring poorly on the performance index have an average 83% poverty rate.

- **In 2014, 54.7% of public school students are projected to be minorities.** That's a sharp increase from 1997, when minorities made up just 36.7% of students.
- Franklin County will see a 107% increase in our Hispanic population, 53% increase in our Asian population and an 87% increase in the multi-racial population.

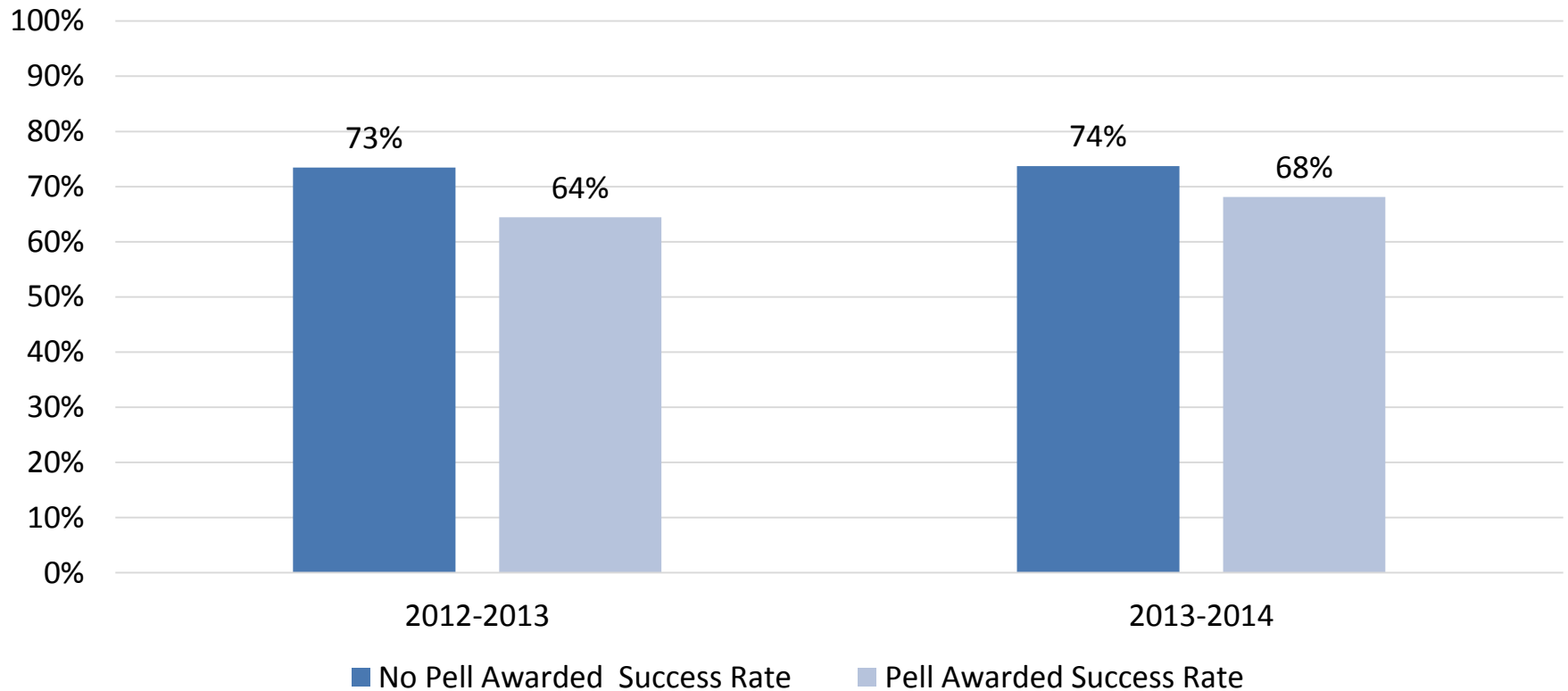
# What we know

- Only 30% of our new students arrive ready to take college courses in all areas.
- Many are first generation students, are economically disadvantaged, attend part-time.
- Identified success gaps: Race/ethnicity, Pell status.

***We're working to close these gaps.  
Preliminary results are encouraging.***

# Course completion increased for the 2012-13 cohort, with greater improvement for low-income students.

Course Completion – Success Rate by Pell Status



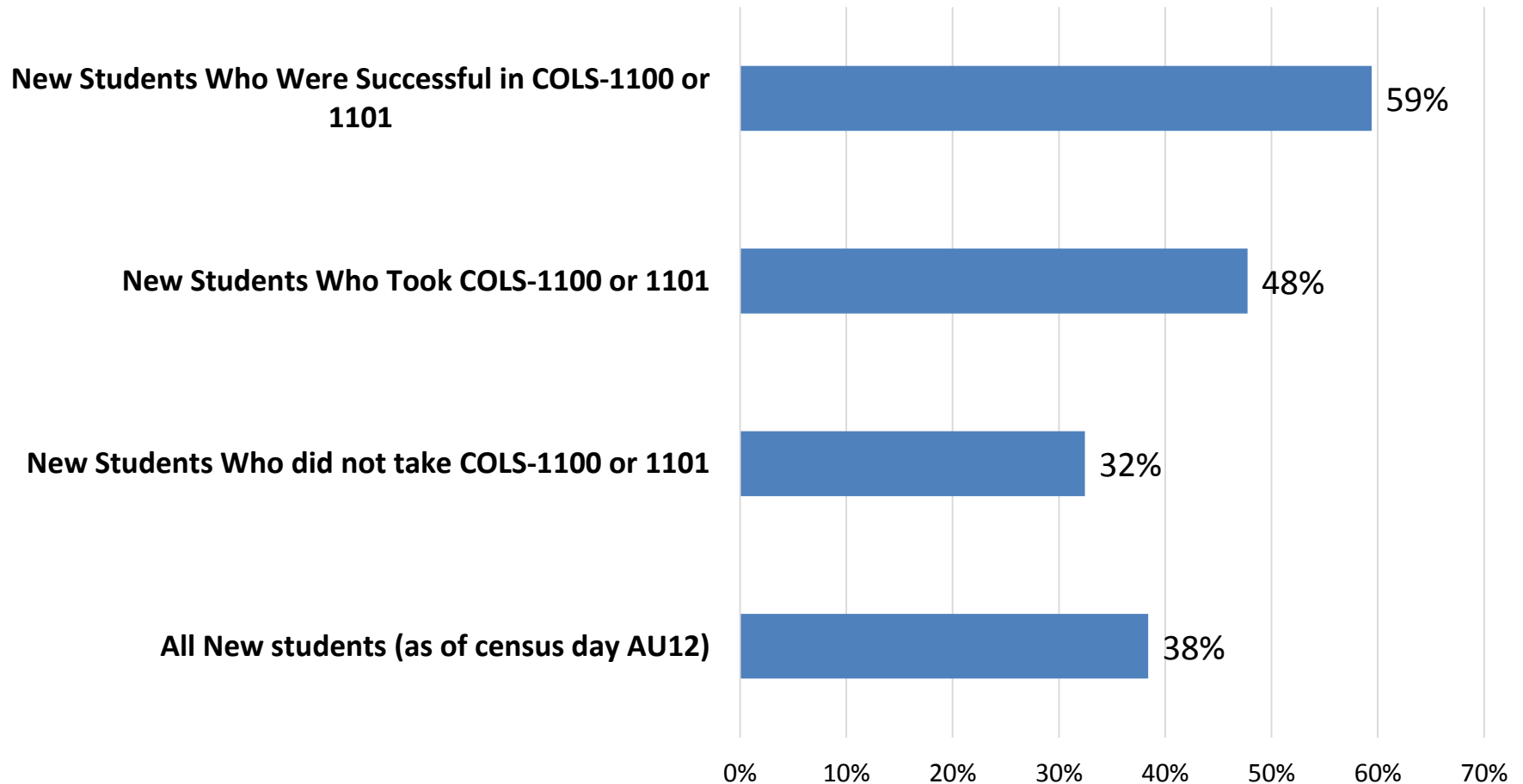
# Improvement in Context

We have ~185,000 courses attempted each academic year. At a 69% success rate, that means that 127,650 attempts were successful (C or better). At a 71% success rate, that number is 131,350.

**An improvement of 2 percentage points means an additional 3,700 successful course completions.**

# Persistence improved for students taking our Success Course.

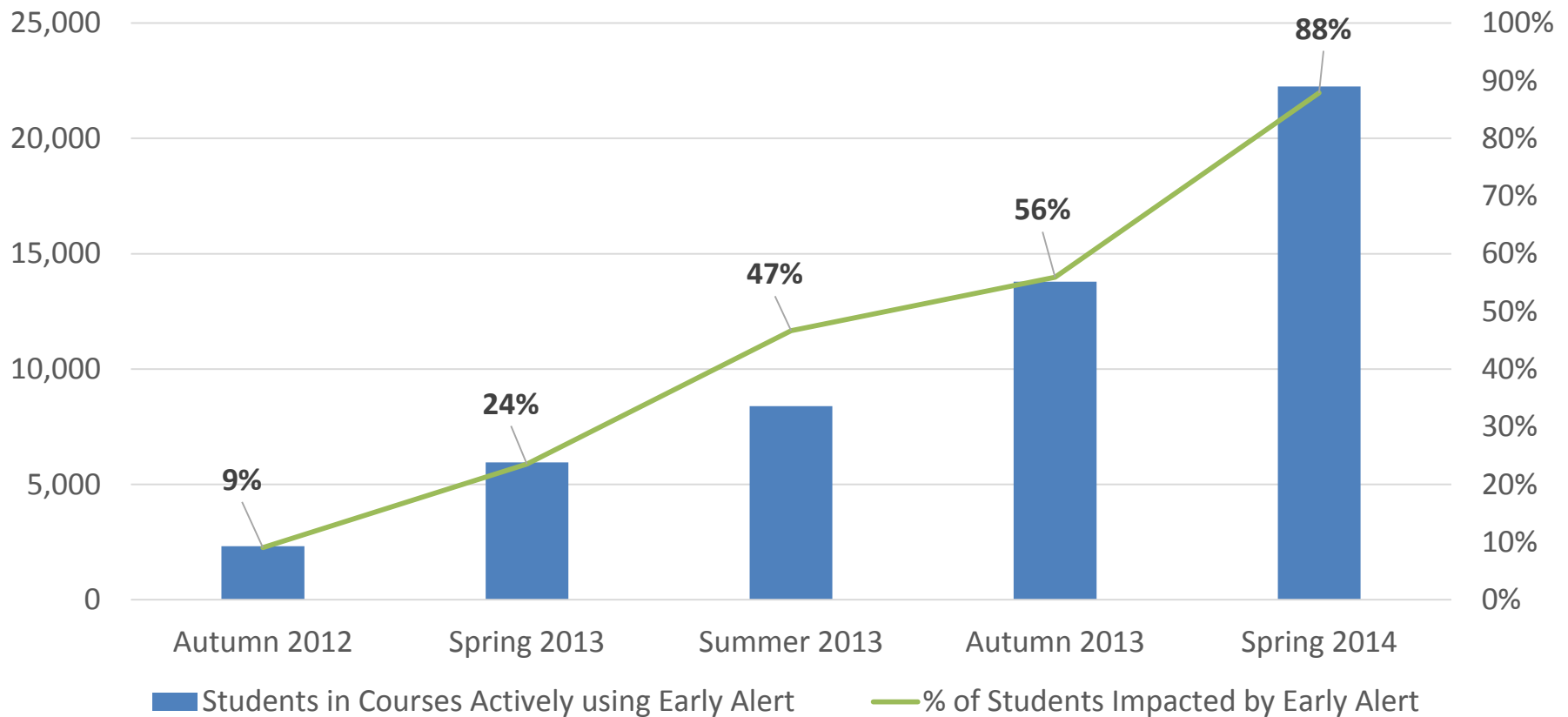
New Student Persistence After One Year

**Growth in Use of Early Alert**

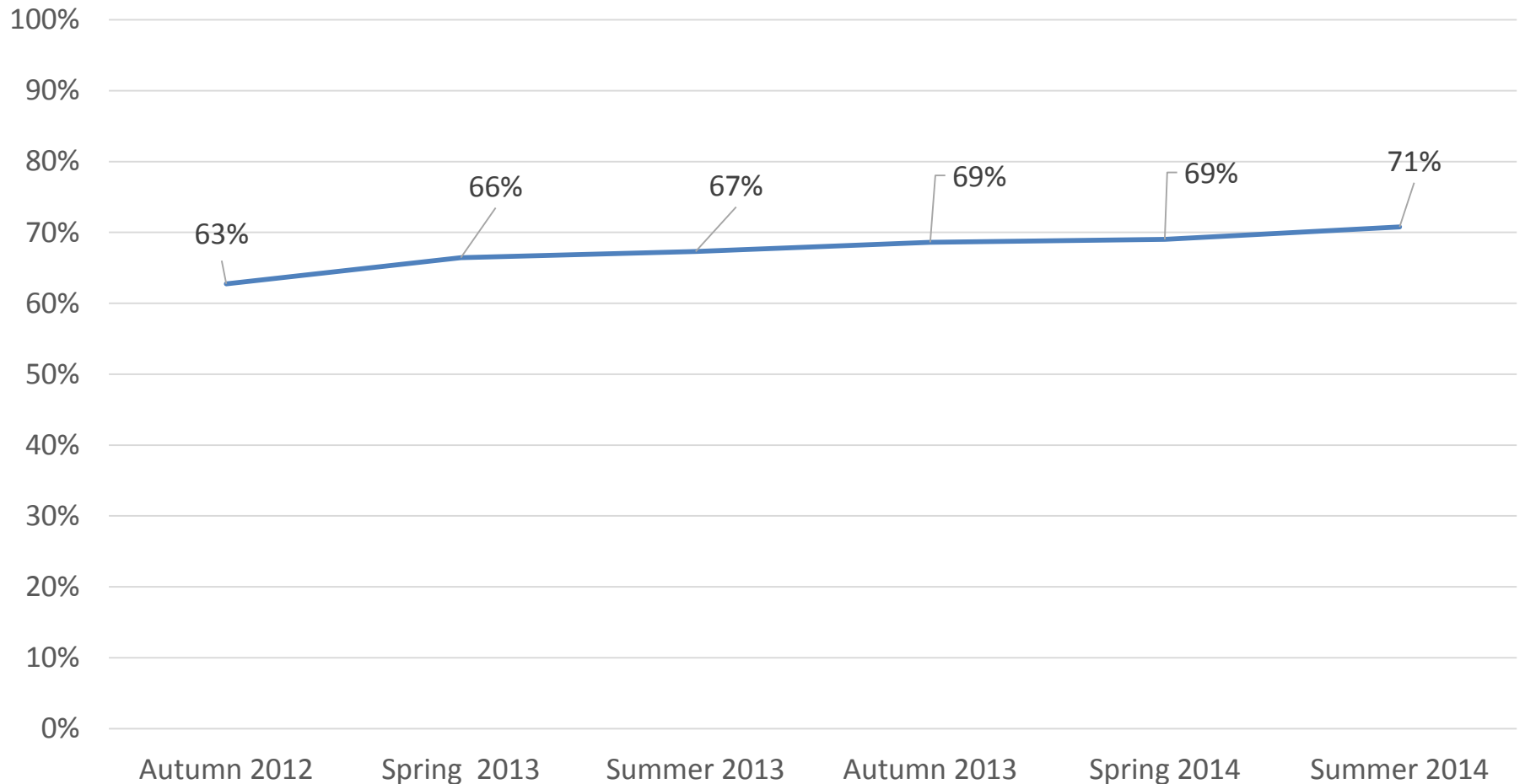


Initial roll-out in Autumn 2012

# Early Alert also helps close performance gaps.

- In the Autumn 2012 Early Alert cohort, students of color and students on Pell showed greater improvements in their year to year persistence rate than the student body as a whole.
- Initial data suggests the same pattern is appearing in course success rates, where students of color and students on Pell showed greater improvements in course success.

**Note, this is early data! We will have more results once Autumn 2014 data is finalized.**

# Student Success & Innovation Fund

- **Student Support Services First Year Experience** – A first year experience (FYE) program for TRiO Student Support Services students will help facilitate greater social and academic engagement.
- **Connect2Complete Peer Advocate Program** – Connecting students to trained peers who can assist them with removing academic and personal barriers to meeting educational goals.
- **Writing Center for Credit: Supporting Students Repeating ENGL1100** – Pilot a new Writing Center program to help repeating ENGL1100 students complete the course successfully.
- **Raspberry Pi** – Test the feasibility of incorporating Raspberry Pi equipment in IT courses to provide more hands-on learning activities across related IT areas.
- **COMPASS Boot Camp** – Test Prep Workshop to provide an intensive test preparation workshop in order to increase students' COMPASS placement tests.
- **BLUEprint Funding the Future** – To expand the availability, content, delivery format and scope of the current BLUEprint Workshop.
- **Student Financial Literacy Project** – To create a series of online objects that will help students with Personal Finance Topics.
- **Moving to Scale with Active Learning** – To train selected faculty on creating and implementing active learning teaching, implement targeted activities during the 2014-15 academic year and measure results.



# Student Success & Innovation Fund

- **Faculty Action Research in Active and Collaborative Learning** – To learn to practice and model rigorous action research (AR) by creating and supporting a faculty learning community engaged in evaluating the effect of Active and Collaborative Learning (ACL).
- **Student to Active Citizen Transformation** – Provide students opportunity for self-discover and awareness, develop leadership skills, provide meaningful community service, sustain healthy behaviors, explore careers, and engage faculty towards becoming responsible global citizens.
- **Arts and Sciences Learning Communities** – Create student learning communities built around a block schedule.
- **Register Blast – College Testing Services** software that will allow the center to streamline the front line process resulting in more efficient service to both students and faculty.
- **Generation One Trailblazers (GOT): Engagement for First Generation Students** – To provide first generation students with support by a faculty driven resource group established in 2010.
- **The Role of the Speed Diversity Dialogue** – To train faculty to execute simple, yet effective in-class exercise and empirically evaluate effectiveness of the exercise in increasing student awareness of diversity.
- **Pay It Forward** – Student Philanthropy Service Learning project development to support and institutionalize the Pay It Forward (PIF) Student Philanthropy Service-Learning Initiative.
- **The Orgsync Platform: Create a More Efficient and Connected Campus** – Establish an infrastructure to connect up to 50 campus entities supporting student success and provide a campus-wide tracking and assessment system.
- **GEOLinks Project** – To provide insight and critical thinking regarding geology and the fact that geology and earth-related issues can be observed everyday.

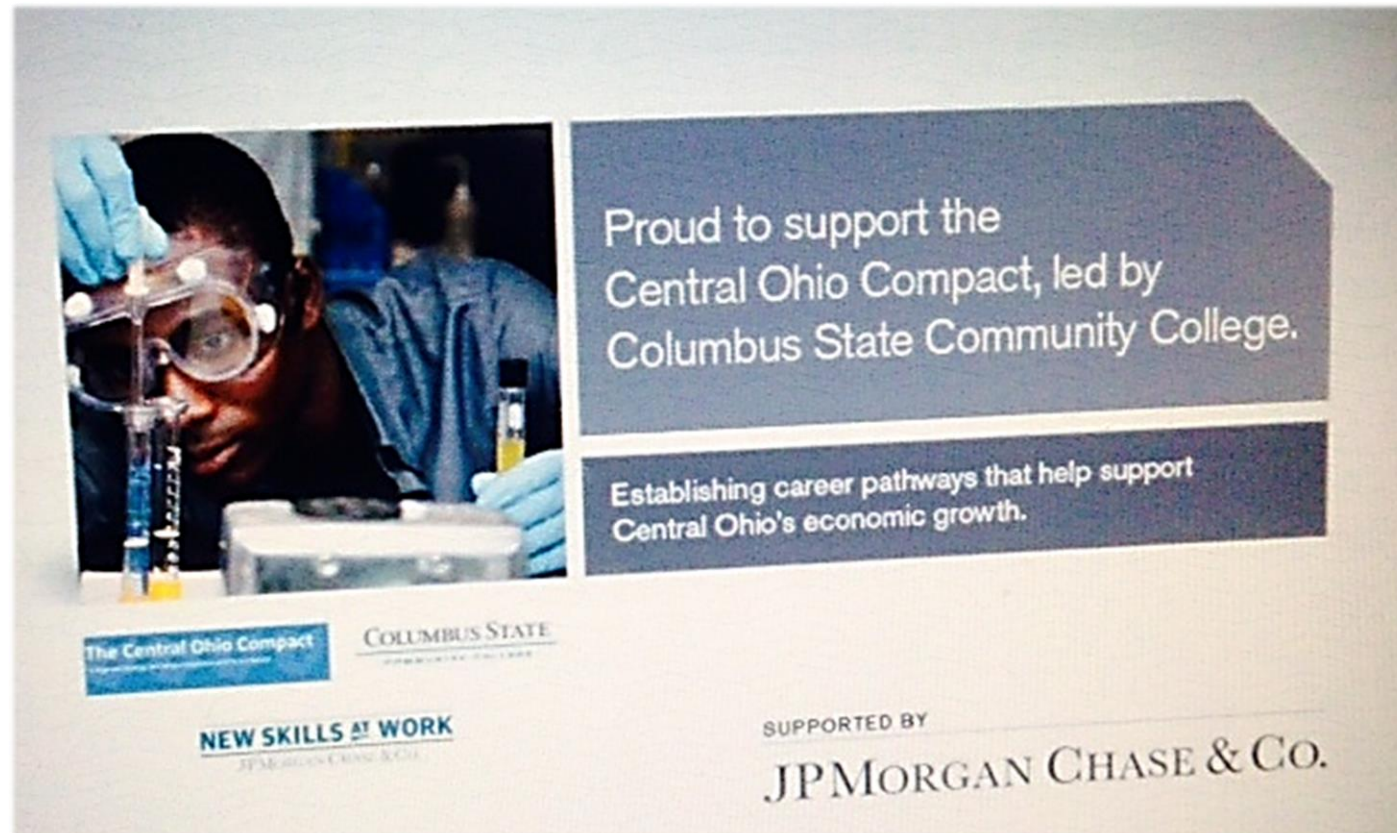

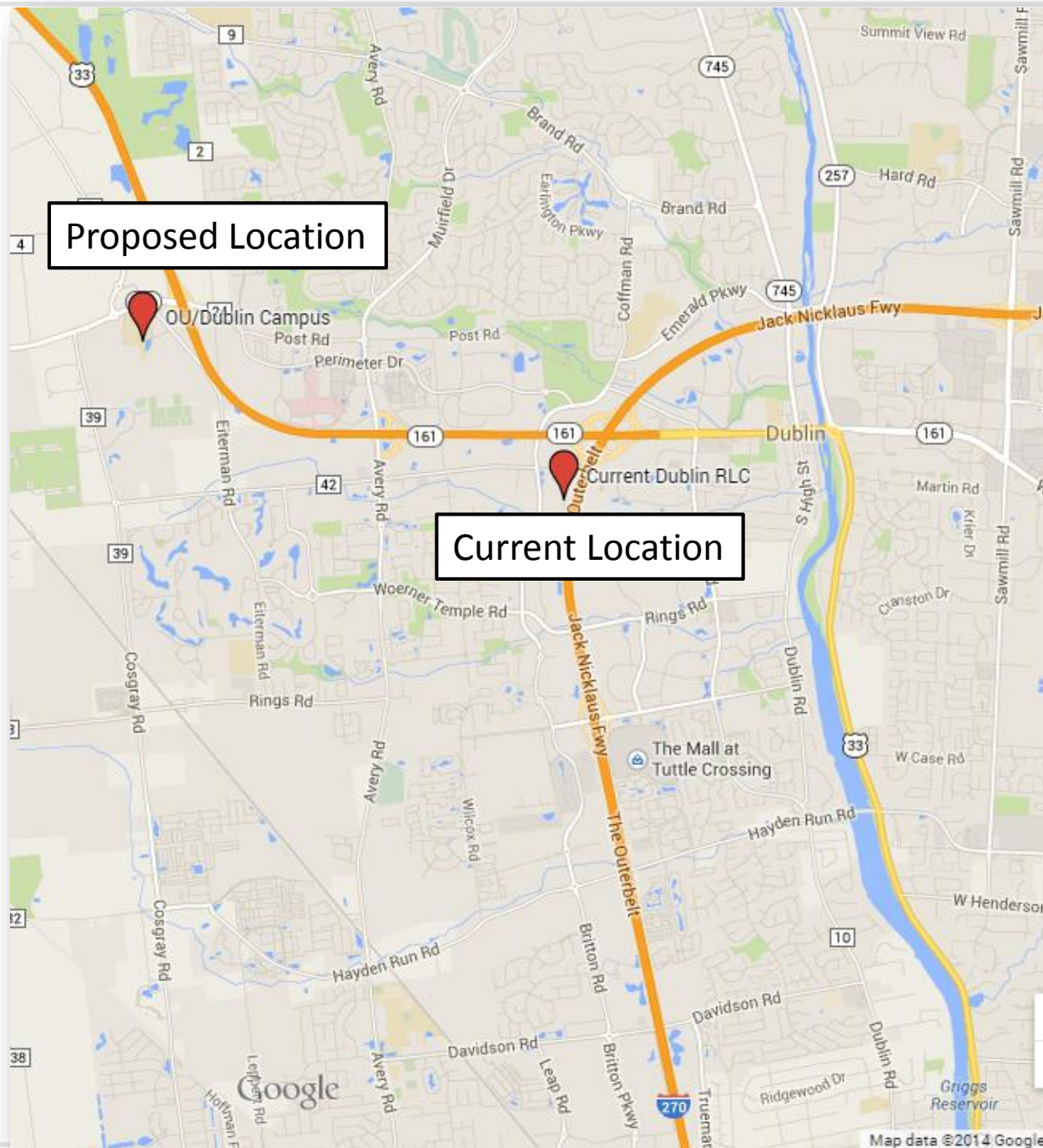

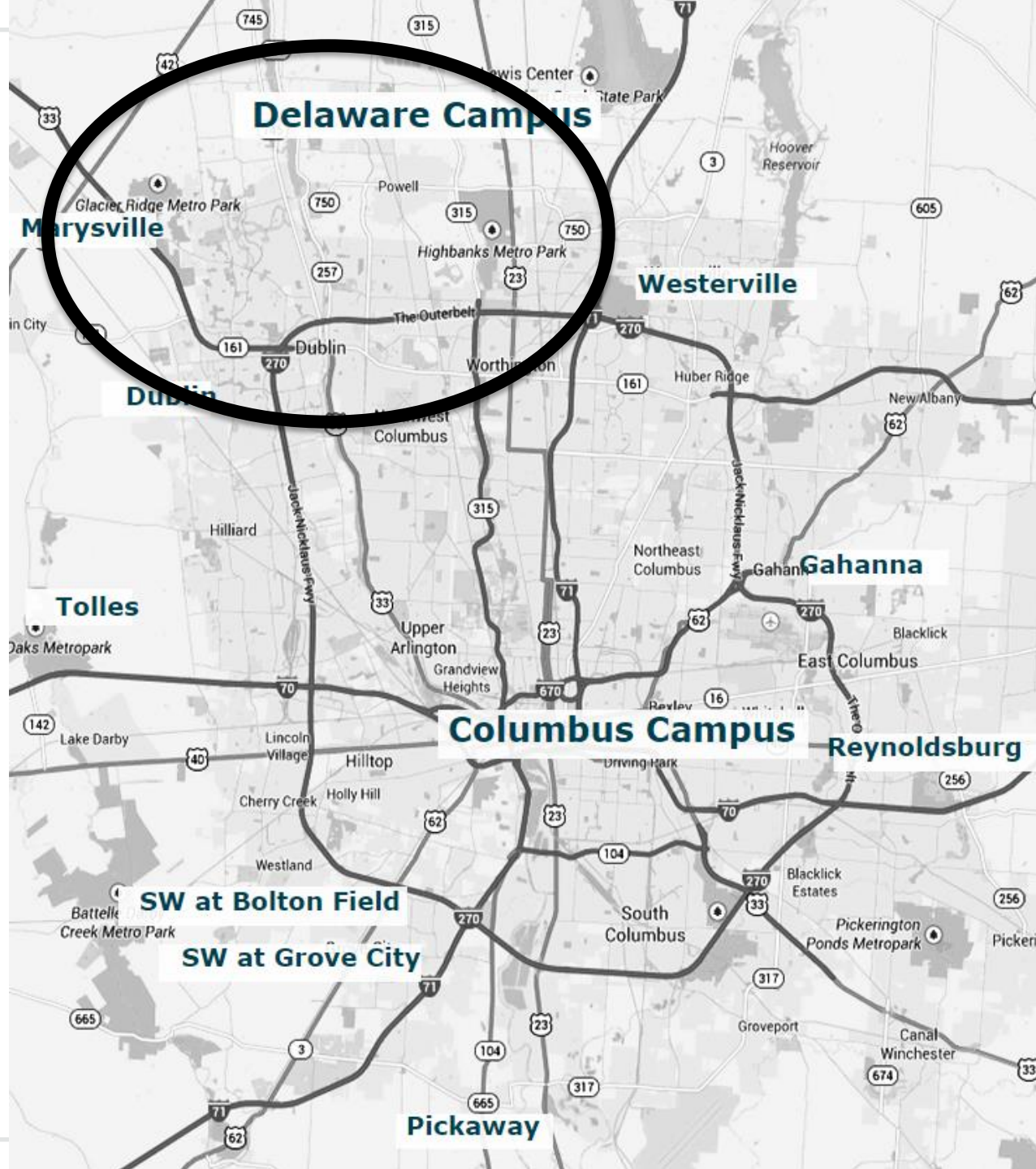
