THIRD STEP: VISIT COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES

- How did you feel about the school after your visit? Did it feel like a good fit? What are the students like?
- What is the academic reputation of the institution and the program?
- What are the specific degree requirements for your program and do they seem interesting to you? Are there specific requirements to be admitted to your major?
- Are there student groups, student government, or other clubs/organizations that interest you?
- Does the institution offer courses at times and in formats that work for your schedule/circumstances?
- Does the college have programs available that assist you in career planning and/or job search following graduation? Are there internships, or other experiential learning opportunities available?
- Have you looked at all of your alternatives?

SECOND STEP: CONSIDER WHAT YOU WANT & RESEARCH

 What do you want from your Bachelor's degree school/program? Some things to consider: programs/degrees offered, whether or not the college and/or major is competitive, size, cost, and scholarship opportunities.
What features are most important to you?

FINAL STEP: ORGANIZE. KNOW THE DEADLINES & APPLY

- Organize materials in a folder and label them appropriately.
- There may be an application for both the college and your major. Make sure you know!
- Learn the process for applying/receiving financial aid and scholarships.
- Keep an updated copy of your CSCC Degree Audit and bring it when you meet with other colleges.
- Begin to keep track of your next college's deadlines so you don't miss anything.
- Secure letters of recommendation and related paperwork for selective enrollment programs and/or scholarships.
- Know the policy for evaluation of transfer credit and send your CSCC transcript when requested:
